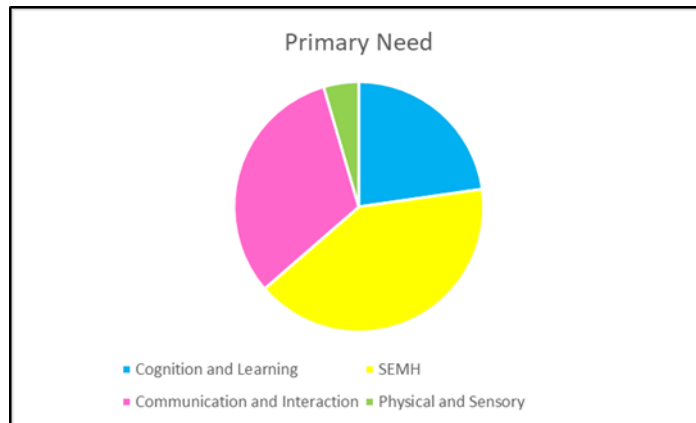

The School Council, Eco-council, Well-being Council, Art Ambassadors and Sports Crew are democratically elected by peers. Any child can put themselves forward to be elected as a councillor; children in each class vote for their preferred councillor. The children elected attend meetings and conduct class councils to ensure they are representing the views of all children within their class.

St Oswald's has positive attitudes to parents/carers and values their important role in their child's education. Parents can find a link to the Newcastle Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information, Advice and Support Service on our website. This service provides

information, advice and support at any stage of a child or young person's education, and provides an Independent Supporter for families in the process of getting an Education Health and Care Plan. Parents are fully involved in the review process and are invited to attend action plan update meetings with the SENDCO and/or class teachers. Interpreters are arranged for parents who require translation during meetings. Written information is in accessible formats and sufficient notice is given for meetings to enable parents/carer time to prepare.

Early Help is used to coordinate support for children and their families who have a range of needs, where appropriate.

Next steps:

Use the Local Authority's new Descriptors of Need and the Universally Available Provision for Schools to ensure there is consistency across all schools in the local area.
