## **Term Dates 2024-25**

As previously communicated, the following days have been identified for staff training on which school will be closed to children:

Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 2024

Monday 6th January, 2025

Friday 23rd May, 2025

In addition, this year, school will close for the October half term at the end of the day on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> October. **School will therefore be closed to both children and staff on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October.** An extra day's holiday had to be allocated in order for school to be open for 190 days across the academic year.

For your information, a copy of the term dates (which were shared earlier this year) has been attached to the email this newsletter was sent out on.

### Change to the end of the school day

A reminder, that in order to comply with the government's expectation that schools should be open to all children for a minimum of 32.5 hours per week, the pick-up time for children in Reception and KS1 will change slightly from September 2024. The doors will open as normal at 8:35am and the children will be collected at 3:05pm instead of 3pm.

Arrangements for KS2 will remain unchanged (8:30am doors open; 3pm pick-up).

#### **Sports Day**

On Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> July, after consecutive days of (horrendous) rain, we chanced our luck and went ahead with Sports Day. The children had a brilliant day, never letting the prospect of a potential soaking get in their way. The weather held off (just) and everyone, young and old, had a great time.
